~Compare and contrast two or more versions of the same story.

~Students use graphic organizers to differentiate the elements of two stories.

~Describe the connection between a series of historical events, scientific ideas or concepts, or steps in technical procedures in a text.

~Determine the meaning of words and phrases in a text.

~Use glossaries to find meanings of words.

~Identify main idea of text.

~Read along as text is read to them.

~Know and apply grade-level phonics and analysis skills in decoding words.

~Decode two-syllable words with long vowels.

~Decode words with prefixes and suffixes.

~Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.

~Write arguments to support claims with sufficient evidence.

~Conduct research projects.
